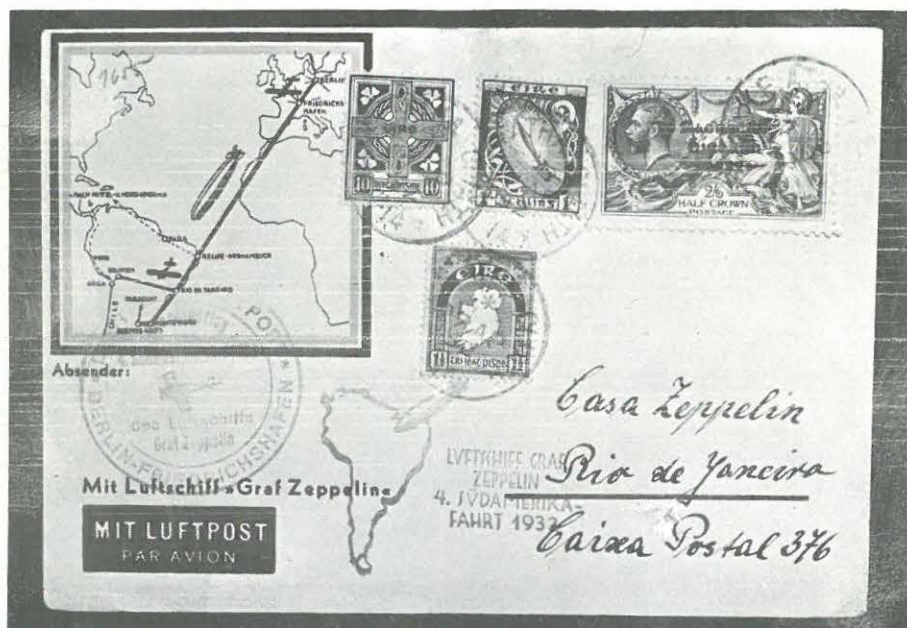

STAMPS CUT FROM POSTAL STATIONERY  
AND USED AS ADHESIVES



The Irish Post Office Guide specifically mentions that the stamps on postal stationery, if not already used, may be cut out and glued to other cards or envelopes. They will then be accepted as prepaying the postage, the only restriction being that the stamps cut from registration envelopes may be used only on registered mail. The practice has never been common, and most of the known examples are "philatelic", i.e. contrived by collectors, but not all. In 1954 the Electricity Supply Board used 1½d stamps from obsolete forms to pay the postage on a batch of accounts.

## OUTSTANDING DISCOVERIES!

Remarkable finds have come to hand, thanks to Mr. Fred Dixon. They are three rare cancellations. Never having been recorded to the best of our knowledge, it is our pleasure to give full details in this, the first issue of our new-style "D.F. NEWS-LETTER".



The first one is a "ROSSLARE FISHGUARD PACKET" - code E - 11th August 1902" - single circle - 20½ m.m. diameter, cancelling a Queen Victoria 1900 ½d Blue green.

It was long suspected that the Rosslare Fishguard Packet had a cancellation of its own, but no specimen was known to Irish Postal Historians. Now at last, I am delighted to record that such exists.

But most intriguing is the date - 1902. There is unquestionable evidence of a mail packet in 1906. A mystery to all postal historians, is why a cachet or handstamp belonging to this service has not yet come to light.

Now this example has been discovered. It not only gives evidence to the service of mail between these ports, but confirms the existence of a service four years earlier than hitherto recorded!



The second rarity: "BANTRY-CORK-M.C.-UP.- 4th March 1903" - Single circle, 24mm diameter on a King Edward VII ½d. Blue green.

We have known of the S.T. (Sorting Tender) and the S.C. (Sorting Coach), but this is the first time I have seen "M.C." It must surley stand for Mail Coach. Can anyone certify?



The final item, and to me the most exciting, is:- "ENNIS-DUNDALK-G.N.R.I. T.P.Q.-N." Code A (Lying sideways) - 4th January 1907.

The reason I find this cancel interesting, is because ENNIS is in Co.Clare, and on the Great Southern Railway. DUNDALK is in Co. Meath and on the Great Northern Railway line. Here we have the case of a connection between the two companies!

In our article in the Philypia issue of Stamp Magazine, on the Railway Letter Fee

stamps of Ireland, we illustrated a cover with the Railway Letter Fee Stamp of the Dublin Wilklow and Wexford Railway, which was cancelled by the Company's handstamp, oval Double Ring type, D.W.W.R./31 JUL 1901/ LOOP LINE/ Amiens Street.

We explained that the "LOOP LINE" was a connecting line between the two stations, "WESTLAND ROW" D.W.W.R. and "AIMENS ST" G.N.R.(I). Now there is also another "LOOP LINE" between "AIMENS ST" and "KINGSBRIDGE" Station (G.S.R.) which connects the Southern and Northern lines. This loop line actually passes underneath part of the Phoenix Park and comes up near Cabra, and at one point the Midland line passes over the "LOOP LINE"!

This is the first positive evidence of a continued service between the Southern and Northern lines. Hitherto, this was unrecorded and as such is of great importance to Irish Postal History.

Illustrated at left, is an unused vertical strip of five of Ireland's rarest coil. It is also of course, one of the highest catalogued of all her stamps in all the major catalogues.

This item must achieve significant pride of place as one of Ireland's most valuable philatelic pieces.

Literature: The Handbook of Irish Philately achieved a Large Silver.

On the commercial side, all the Br. Europe territories were in strong demand. Particularly popular were the prospective postal histories of Cyprus, Gibraltar, Ireland and Malta.

The international has certainly re-confirmed that London remains probably the leading world stamp centre.

It was a fine encouragement to all to see the number of young people who were buying with great discrimination. These young people know what they want, shop for the best buys, and aim high for quality. Of course there were many middle-aged and elderly people who had also decided at this time to take up their hobby more seriously and who appreciated professional advice. The emphasis was again on quality. The prospect of cultivating future generations of good quality collectors is thus a challenging and exciting one.

### 1. DESCRIPTION

### 2. VIEWING

All lots of a suitable size can be sent through the post for inspection, postage and insurance both ways being borne by the client. Clients may view lots in our offices by making an appointment and specifying which lots are required to be seen. With regard to new clients who request lots for postal viewing, full cash deposit (reserve price) or adequate references should be furnished.

### 3. METHOD OF PURCHASE

Lots will be sold to the highest bidders, at the reserve, or at one step above the next highest bid. Should there be two equal highest bids, the buyer at that figure will be the sender of the bid received first.

### 4. CONDITIONS OF SALE

- (a) Although we provide a special form, bids and orders can be made on any form.
- (b) Bids, orders and settlement for purchases may be made in any currency but we shall only consider the sterling equivalent according to the current exchange rates.
- (c) Bids from clients unknown to us are only accepted on the understanding that the lots will be paid for against pro-forma invoice.
- (d) Postage, packing and registration or insurance will be charged on the lots.
- (e) Successful purchasers will be immediately notified and the lots sent to them as soon as the remittances are received, unless well-known to us. Uncleared lots will be similarly offered to the next highest bidder.
